

- 1. They worked for shogun ^{at} wartime and were employed by large landowners or "daimyo" when in peace.
- 2. They had many rights and privileges, such as the rights to carry swords, ride horses and so on.
- 3. In exchange for such rights they owed absolute loyalty to their daimyo, and they were even expected to commit suicide when the daimyo died.

4. This tradition was a part of "bushido" or "The way of the warrior", which was a strict code of honour that stressed the importance of self-discipline and bravery.
5. Bushido was based on peaceful beliefs of Zen Buddhism, but despite this it helped the samurai become the most ruthless, feared and brutal warriors in Asia.
6. The samurai reached the peak of their importance and influence during the civil wars in the 16th century, when they fought for rival rival warlords.
7. Peaceful years came after 1603, so the samurai gradually lost military importance, and many of them became administrators, not soldiers.
8. When the last shogun Tokugawa Kelli resigned in 1867, Japan began to modernise military forces, and the conscription and structure of the western army were introduced in 1872.
9. As a result, the samurai became no longer needed or wanted, so the remaining samurai in Satsuma decided to mount a rebellion against the government.
10. The Satsuma rebellion was a disaster for the samurai, and they were finally defeated by the Imperial Army in 1877.
