### Task 3

There has been a spate of muggings in cities across the globe as muggers are focusing on a new item to steal – luxury coats. A man in Birmingham in the UK was slashed across his face as thieves made off with his jacket. Criminals are targeting coats that cost as much as \$2200 each. As well as literally stealing the coats off people's backs, thieves are breaking into people's vehicles. Professor David Wilson, a criminologist at Birmingham City University, warned that the muggings were the start of a new "luxury crimetrend". He said the thieves were "worrying".

Professor Wilson warned those with high-end winter jackets to be careful.
