Paragraph 2:

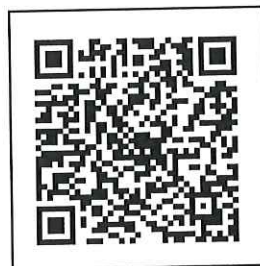
Something slipped at the back of Clara's mind:
