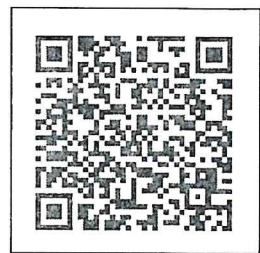
Paragraph 2

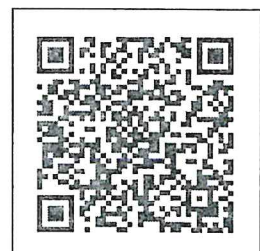
Paragraph 4

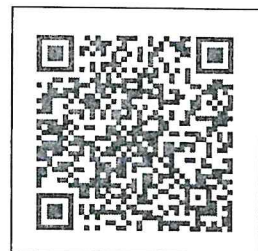

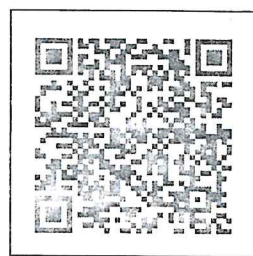

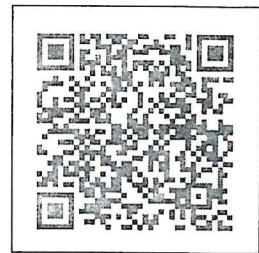
